The employability of Higher Education (HE) graduates seems to be affected by

this, negatively, as HE curricula do not catch up with the rapid changes in the labour market.

The number of unemployed and underemployed graduates (not using their full skills range) in EU steadily increased during the past decade, as employers, companies, enterprises across various economic sectors face difficulties in finding the employees with the right combination of hard and soft skills, who are and will be needed in the new labour-market environment.

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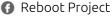












REBOOT YOUR SKILLS AND TAKE THE 4.0 CHALLENGE
